# About Stevens' ENGL 1101

ENGL 1101 is a writing course, and in it, we'll be writing nearly every day. You'll learn not only how to write for college, but also how to express yourself better on paper and how to use writing to help you think well.

## Learning Outcomes:

- Demonstrate effective use of a range of rhetorical strategies in composing for different audiences, purposes, and contexts.
- Draft, revise, and edit at a level of proficiency appropriate for a college-level writer.
- Work effectively with source material in support of the main point of an essay.
- Produce extemporaneous in-class writing at a level of proficiency appropriate for a college-level writer.
